THE BRAVEST ONE

Brave Vietnam War orphan

Jeremiah Smith runs an orphanage in Vietnam. Nyan-Vet, an eleven-year-old boy, loses his family and moves into the orphanage. He is quiet at first, but he becomes one of the most popular children in the orphanage. Nyan-Vet is asked to work around the compound instead of going to school because he causes so much trouble in the classroom. One day, Nyan-Vet meets John Michael Flanagan, a Marine. They become friends and Nyan-Vet spends much of his time with the Marines. John Michael Flanagan decides to adopt Nyan-Vet and take him to the United States. The day before they are to leave, the orphanage is set on fire by bombs. Nyan-Vet runs into the orphanage to save his friends and he is killed. Years later, John Michael Flanagan describes Nyan-Vet as the bravest person he ever met.^{*}
