## **THE GIRL GENERAL (Part 1)**

Joan of Arc

Joan grows up in France and is very kind-hearted. She makes friends with many animals, gives her supper to a stranger, and is kind to the village madman. By the time Joan is sixteen, the Hundred Years War is coming closer to her home, and Joan becomes more and more concerned about her country. Joan's father tells her that there isn't any hope for France, but she refuses to believe it. Joan trusts that God will take care of France. One day, Joan's friend Louis sees Joan in the forest. Joan is clothed in light, listening to a voice Louis can't hear, and speaking to someone Louis can't see. Afterwards, Joan tells Louis that she was speaking to the Archangel Michael and that she is to lead France to victory. Joan meets with the governor, who believes that she is mad. Joan goes to see the governor again, and then again. Finally, the governor agrees that if Joan's prediction comes true, he will send her to the King. The prediction comes true and the governor sends her to the King, but the King won't see Joan. The King sends bishops to get Joan's message, but Joan will not give her message to anyone except the King. Finally, the King himself agrees to see Joan. The King tests Joan by placing an imposter on the throne. Joan passes the King's test, but bishops examine her to see whether she is of God or of Satan. At last, the King appoints Joan to the position of General in Chief of the Armies of France.\*
